





**SERVICES AND SUPPORT BUREAU** 

- > We only offered Stop the Bleed to the public towards the end of 2024, and we hosted 9 classes with 295 students
- > CORE CLASSROOM Presentation was taught to 502 students (a > 2024 National Night Out had over 100 plus vendors, with 80 good portion being HCPS students). Here we had discussions before the video and after for teaching points.
- The CORE Trailer videos were watched by approximately 350 kids.
- > HOPE House request was 21 events with 415 tours.
- Christmas Drive helped a total of 188 families: a total of 264 Adults and 654 Kids received food, clothes, and toys.
- > Abingdon Walmart Shop with a Cop had a total of 39 kids attend, we also provided a full dinner for all volunteers and family members of the kids, which total 124 quests.
- > Fallston Walmart Shop with a Cop had a total of 17 kids.

- With the added donations from both Shop with the Cop events, the HCSO CPU Unit also was able to sponsor and adopt 11 kids from the Ashley's Clubhouse who received gifts from their Wishlist. We were also able to provide the Ashley's Clubhouse with needed materials for the Clubhouse Program, that the kids attending would benefit from.
- being civilian vendors. The Harford County Sheriff's Office 2024 NNO had every local police department represented, as well as all State L.E. agencies in attendance. Estimated attendance was between 2800-3200 people.
- > 2024 Faith in Blue (Trunk or Treat) again broke record numbers. We had a total of 34 vendors and the event was attended by over 1000 people.









### **SERVICES AND SUPPORT BUREAU**

In 2024, the Animal Control Unit responded to a total of 3,129 calls for service. The top three types of calls included 1,011 incidents of loose/stray animals, 505 cases of humane investigations, and 493 owner surrenders.

In 2024, the Training Academy conducted 158 Law Enforcement Inservice classes and 70 Corrections Inservice classes. A total of 17 Law Enforcement recruits graduated across two Academy classes, along with 12 Corrections recruits and 4 Institutional Support Staff. 54 days of training were conducted for outside jurisdictions, enhancing regional training efforts.

### **Building & Technology Services Unit (BATS) Unit**

BATS consists of a Coordinator and four Law Enforcement Support Specialists. Their primary duty is to oversee nearly all AXON products, including BWCs (Body Worn Cameras), TASERS, and FLEET In-Car Video. There are more than 600 BWCs, 300 TASERS, and 200 ICVs currently in use at the Agency. BATS maintains a close relationship with Prosecutors, Paralegals, and Legal Assistants, in the Harford County State's Attorney's Office, as well as partnered and other outside Agencies, assisting in the preparation of video and photo evidence for trials. BATS processes Public Information Act requests for Attorneys, Insurance Companies, as well as private citizens. This is a time-consuming process that normally takes a team approach. The Unit also has the responsibility of facilitating building maintenance requests between the Precincts, Headquarters, and County Facilities.

### **REOUESTS FROM SAO**

These are requests sent to our unit by the SAO. All require BWC/ICV pulls and cases are created.

83 PIA/SUBPOENAS

These are requested by the Records Section where all videos must be redacted prior to release.

### ON CALL ARRESTS

These appear in the On Call Records Management system. Not all require BWC/ICV pulls, some are warrant/criminal summons served so no video is needed. All must be researched by personnel to see if a case creation is needed.

**REQUESTS FOR MUST APPEAR CITATIONS** These were BWC/ICV pulls for Criminal Traffic Violations

initiated by the deputies.

### **CORRECTIONAL SERVICES BUREAU**

The Harford County Detention Center is a full-service detention facility that houses up to 820 inmates across maximum, medium, and minimum-security levels. These security levels include designated housing units for classification intake, medical holding, and restrictive housing based on the specific needs of each inmate. The Detention Center remains committed to providing quality incarceration services by offering a range of programs and resources aimed at rehabilitation and successful reentry into the community.



The Harford County Detention Center ensures that all inmates, including those in administrative segregation and protective custody, have access to a variety of programs and services. These include educational opportunities, social services, counseling, religious guidance, library access, and recreational activities. The objective of these programs is to engage inmates in meaningful activities that contribute to the safe and secure operation of the facility while also equipping them with skills to aid in their successful reintegration into society. Effective programming directly correlates with fewer repeat offenses, ultimately fostering safer communities.



### Chaplain

The Chaplain's Office provides essential spiritual support and resources to inmates during their incarceration. Chaplains assist inmates in making a spiritual connection within the faith of their choice and help develop structured reentry plans. The facility currently benefits from the support of **3 volunteer chaplains**. Inmates have access to Bibles, spiritual meetings, counseling, religious dietary accommodations, and worship services as part of their faith-based rehabilitation.



### **Community Services**

The Community Services Coordinator plays a vital role as the reentry specialist for the inmate population. By collaborating with numerous community agencies, the coordinator assists inmates in transitioning back into society, ensuring they have access to the resources needed for successful reintegration.



### **Transport Unit**

The Transport Unit ensures the safe and secure movement of inmates to and from courts, correctional institutions, and medical facilities throughout the state. In addition to in-person transport, the unit utilizes Closed Circuit Television (CCTV) technology for court appearances and medical interviews. In 2024, the Transport Unit conducted 2,514 inmate transports and facilitated 2,014 bail reviews.




# Interagency Processing Center/Booking Operating 24/7, 365 days a year, the Interagency Processing Center (IPC)

is the initial point of entry for individuals arrested in Harford County. Upon arrival, arrestees undergo fingerprinting, photographing, and warrant checks through local, state, and national databases. The IPC also employs advanced body scanning technology to detect contraband and weapons efficiently while maintaining a less intrusive search process. In 2024, the IPC processed 3,049 new intakes from 7 different local and state agencies.

The Harford County Detention Center remains committed to its mission of maintaining a secure and rehabilitative environment while ensuring public safety and the successful reintegration of inmates into the community.







In our commitment to delivering exceptional care to inmates in our custody, we collaborate with contractors to ensure that their nutritional and medical requirements are fully met throughout their period of incarceration.






